National Director Report

Paul DuBois is the new VP Northeast Area, FMCA.

The free Membership certificates (5), that we questioned, were sent to each chapter to recruit new FMCA members. 2500 were sent and so far 84 new members have joined FMCA.

Here is a report from the FMCA membership committee to the executive committee:

- 1. To look into packaging several member benefits and offering them for one amount to all members;*
- 2. To explore the possibility of placing target ads in other publications;*
- 3. To print the "Benefits at a glance" wallet cards and have them available at area rallies and conventions; and,*
- 4. To update the benefits listing in the magazine to show which benefits are included with the membership and which have a cost involved.*

From the FMCA Executive Board meeting:

- 1. Procedure Committee concerning additional actions. A report that the associate chapter concept was defined in the Chapter Definitions. Scenarios for an associate chapter could be when a chapter is having difficulty filling officer positions, when a chapter does not have enough members but still wants to hold rallies, or when a chapter does not want to participate in FMCA's governance. For example; a chapter outside the United States and Canada would be an associate chapter and would not be covered by FMCA's liability insurance. The associate chapter would only*

need 10 to form a chapter and 7 to maintain certification. A quorum for a meeting 25% or 15 whichever is less; but not less than four. Mailings would be only to the chapter president.

2. Will not renew MEDEX for 2010. The cost amounts to 5% of the total budget. There will also be various increases in registrations and fees.

3. 2010 budget of \$299,556 was passed, which is a deficit, but will be covered by operating reserves, if required.

Tech Talk

Engine Oil Changes

In the last few years engine oils have been changed to where many of them do not lubricate flat tappet engines well enough. Our 455 & 403 engines are in this category.

There is a detailed article on the subject in the Summer 2007 newsletter and can be viewed on our website.

Finding oils with the API CI-4, SJ, or SL labeling is almost impossible now. The later oils such as API CJ-4 and SM require the addition of an additive to make it safe for flat tappet engines. For someone who wants to stay on conventional oil then Rotella T in the white jugs (15w-40) is a good choice---if you want to use a synthetic---then Rotella T in the dark blue jug (5w-40) is a good choice (same level as other level III synthetics ie: Mobil 1---Syntec etc etc.).

Relocate the Transmission Vent

A recent coach fire in one of the other GMC chapters was suspected to be caused by transmission oil coming out the vent on the top of the transmission and landing on the hot exhaust. To prevent the oil from landing on the exhaust a hose should be attached to the vent and run to the side of the coach and a small cap installed to replace the one removed from the transmission vent.



People Door Hinge Pins & Bushings

If your entrance door is not closing as easily as it used to or there is movement when you lift up the door, you probably need to replace the hinge pins and bushings. John Evans found the correct pins and bushings still available at GM dealers. The pin is part # 15699635 at \$6.35 US and a bushing is part # 9721917 at \$1.04 US. Two pins and four bushings are needed per door.

The Best Thing I did to Our Coach!!

I went over almost 20 improvements done to our coach in the past 10 to 15 years and had a lot of trouble deciding on what was the "Best". The short list included six- wheel disc brakes, a macerator, rear anti-sway bars, a

permanent rear bed, etc., etc., In the end, I decided the lowering of the final drive ratio to 3.70:1 improved the driveability substantially without a significant loss in fuel economy and made towing a car very easy.
