GMC Heritage Cruisers Cocktail Munchies & Potluck Goodies Book

Here are two more excellent examples of recipes submitted for the Goodies Book.

BEST BROWNIES

Stir: ¾ c. cocoa
½ tsp. baking soda
1/3 c. oil
Add: ½ c. boiling water, stir until thick
Add: 2 c. sugar
2 eggs
1/3 c. oil beat until smooth
Add: 1 1/3 c. flour
1 tsp vanilla
¼ tsp. salt
Bake at 350 for 30-35 min in 9 x 13 greased
pan. Do not over bake.

1/4 Cup Shredded Coconut1/4 Ib (370 g) Frozen or Fresh Shrimp (Cooked)

- 2 Tablespoon Fresh Cilantro, Finely Chopped

- 2 Tablespoon Fresh Lime Juice
- 2 Teaspoon Soya Sauce
- 2 Teaspoons Hot Chili Sauce (e.g. A Touch of Thai Garlic Chili Pepper Sauce)
 Freshly Grated Pepper to Taste
 Tortilla Chips (Loblaws Tostitos Gold)
 In Dry Skillet, Toast Coconut Till Lightly
 Golden (transfer To Bowl)
 Add Rest of Ingredients, Chop Shrimp
 Coarsely & Add
 Put a Teaspoon of Mixture on a Tortilla Chip

6000 Mile Trip to the Body Shop

I thought some of you in the Great White North might like to hear about our trip to Mexico. We are in La Penita de Jaltemba, Pacific coast of Mexico, about an hour north of Puerto Vallarta.

Travelling: Took our sweet time getting here and arrived January 30th --2682 miles and \$895 US for gas. Don & Eileen Casselman travelled with us. They had a few problems with their coach along the way--furnace fan in Indiana when they really needed it; alternator in Effingham, Illinois; and, a vapour lock in the Mexican heat and mountains. We put my spare electric pump on and they were OK the rest of the way. Our coach worked well except for an intermittent failure of the starter. We had it rebuilt here in the campground for \$22 US.

Roads are second class compared to ours, even the multi-lanes, and a little narrower with no shoulders usually. Toll roads are ferociously expensive. We used the "libre" roads most of the time. Village streets are usually collections of craters.

Economics: Most things are cheaper, although gas is about the same as at home. New glasses and new lens for my old ones were \$272 US. It's almost cheaper to eat out. Dental work like teeth cleaning is \$45 US.

Climate: There was a little rain when we first arrived--the first since October -- and sunny ever since. The ocean temperature is 80.5 F / 27 C. I measured it -- we're about 100 yards from an almost deserted beach.

People: Mexicans must be the friendliest people on the planet. They have embarrassed us with kindness many times. Their little kids and babies are drop dead gorgeous -- you want to take them all home. Mexico seems to be a third-world country trying to leapfrog into first world status.

Some gringo said, "I can't stand all this poverty, this messiness ". (It's true in the sense that there doesn't seem to be a national consciousness yet about keeping the countryside clean and neat. Come to think of it, we could use a little of that in Canada). Jim Mooney, whom many of you met at the Flamboro Rally and who has been down here several years, replied, "Well, look at their faces. They're smiling. You're the one with the frown". Jim, by the way, lost a motor in his GMC on the way down and had to have it rebuilt in Guadalajara. He says now he knows there is another way to remove a motor from a GMC besides the hoist frame that you see in the GMC Shop Manual. Six Mexicans and a pole work "real well". How in the world six guys could all stand up at the front of a coach, let alone lift a 455 out of the hole there is beyond me, but they did.

The Body Shop: Our coach went in to the body shop yesterday, (23rd of February). I'm willing to admit I'm nervous. If you saw the shop, you would be too; walls, roof over part of it, an old tarp over another part, and dirt floors. I would never have entrusted my coach to such a shop, if I hadn't seen the quality of the work coming out of it. Mind you, you all know that anything will be an improvement on our coach. The owner's name is Jesus (pronounced "Haysoos", so our GMC is in the "hands of Jesus") and he's very conscientious. He and his wife are sleeping in the shop during the 3 weeks it will be there just to make sure it's OK! We're renting a trailer in the campground while the work is being done.

Doug and Adeline Barber drove down from Mazatlan two weeks ago and stayed in a beautiful little hotel for most of a week in the town of La Penita. We had a lot of fun, as you can imagine. They liked it well enough that they're returning in another week or so. Today, 4 March, we just got back from Puerta Vallarta, - stayed with the Mooney's in their time share there, a brand new (as of

October) ultra luxury resort, the Grand Mayan. We needed a break from the strenuous relaxing, don't you know. Man, that's some place. The rich are different from the rest of us - they have more money.

Tips from Trips

At a Coach Storage session at a recent other-chapter rally, a small three-drawer box was suggested to keep the many little items that make their way into our coaches. Walmart stores sell them. They are made by Sterilite. They are 7"x7"x7" and we found them to be excellent for keeping the clutter to a minimum and to be able to find the little items easily. The cupboard over the bed is a perfect spot for at least one of them.

Tech Talk

Throne Repairs

Most of our coaches came with the Aqua Magic GL or GH model toilets and they have lasted well over the years. There are two repair kits available to stop leaks and I have had to put both on the last two years.

The toilet has to be removed from the little room to put either kit in and a sealing ring is provided with each kit to be put on the bottom of the toilet to keep odours in the holding tank. First, was the peddle valve kit and the new ring was put on. The old ring was disintegrating and badly compressed – wasn't doing its "job"!! Recently, the vacuum break kit had to be installed. The two-year old sealing ring was hardened and compressed like the very old one taken out two years earlier – again not doing its "job".

Instead of putting the rubber-sealing ring on this time, I put a wax ring that is used under toilets in houses — they seem to last for years. They fit our toilets and I am quite sure will provide a longer and better seal — cost less than \$2.00.

I also replaced the very rigid plastic water supply line to the toilet with a 24" steel braided water line that is used on taps in kitchens and bathrooms. It is very flexible and therefore easier to connect to the toilet in the small spaces. The very flexible line removed all pressure where it was connected to the toilet and the water line.

Hope that was the last of removing the "throne" from the little room.
